The Curley Chronicle is back!

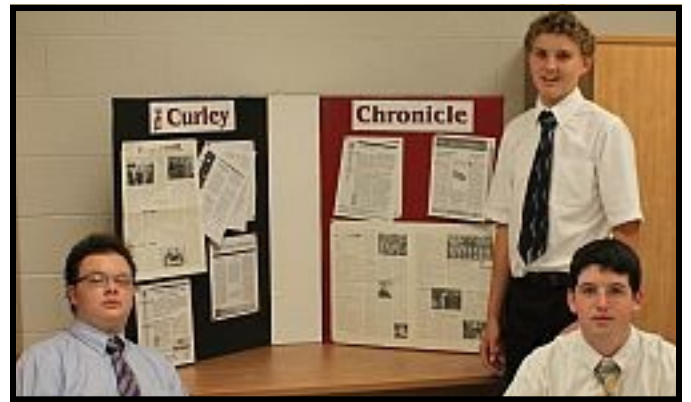
