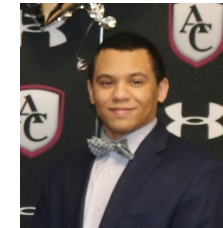

What is my favorite memory? The truth is I can't really answer that. I have many great memories I've made with many different friends, ones I'll take with me and never forget.

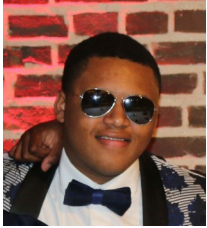

Stats for the Class of 2019

The members of the Class of 2019 were offered admission by 122 different colleges and universities. Additionally, they submitted over 750 college applications and a total of over 350 acceptances were received. In a few short months, members of the Class of 2019 will start the next part of their lives at several 2 year colleges and 44 different four year colleges/universities in 14 different states.

In total, the members of the Class of 2019 were awarded over \$18.4million dollars in merit aid and scholarships. This amount is the most in the history of Archbishop Curley High School.
