

Endowed Scholarships at Archbishop Curley High School

The Alumni Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to the sons of graduates and is based on financial need.

The Amrhein Family Scholarship

This award is based on financial need.

The Salvatore Aquia Memorial Wrestling Scholarship

This award is given to an incoming freshman who is an exemplary student-athlete and participates in junior league wrestling.

The Charles W. Atkinson Jr. '72 Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance.

The Baltimore City Community Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to a Baltimore City resident.

The Jeffrey T. Baynes Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a music program student from Shrine of the Little Flower Parish.

The Fr. Joseph Benicewicz OFM Conv. '78 Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need, with preference given to a student from the Graceland Park/Dundalk area.

The Brockmeyer & Cawley Family Scholarship

The Selection Committee shall make an award from the Scholarship Fund based upon the following criteria in descending priority: (1) an incoming freshman who is a graduate from St. Ursula School or St. Joseph (Fullerton) School or is a member of the St. Ursula, St. Joseph (Fullerton), or St. Ignatius (Hickory) parishes; (2) the student has placed in the top 20% of the High School Placement Test or comparable standardized test administered for placement in a Catholic high school in the Archdiocese of Baltimore; (3) the student's anticipated contribution to furthering Archbishop Curley High School's mission and thereby reputation in the greater Baltimore community; (4) demonstrated academic achievement; and (5) financial need. In the event no incoming freshman meets criteria (1) along with each of criteria (2) through (4) inclusive, the Selection Committee shall make an award to an incoming freshman meeting criteria (2) through (5), inclusive. This award applies to tuition only at Archbishop Curley High School. The grant may be awarded to the same student in subsequent years based upon criteria (1), (3), (4), and (5) in descending priority.

The Church of the Annunciation Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a member of The Church of the Annunciation parish or another Catholic parish

The Joseph R. & Margaret E. Citro Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement and is given to a student who "gives something back" in an extraordinary way to his family, to society, or the community.

The Michael S. Clarke '84 Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a member of the soccer program.

The Class of 1965 Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement, with preference given to a grandson or relative of a member of the Class of 1965 or an otherwise grandson of a Curley alumnus.

The Class of 1966 Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement, with preference given to a grandson or relative of a member of the Class of 1966 or an otherwise grandson of a Curley alumnus.

The grant may be awarded to the same student in subsequent years, based on financial need, good deportment, and maintaining a minimum 3.0 GPA.

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement, with preference given to a graduate of St. Michael the Archangel School, Overlea.

The Amanda Diferdinando-Youtsey Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance.

The Andrew DiFerdinando Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a member of the soccer program.

The Anthony J. DiFerdinando Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance.

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance.

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement.

This award goes to a student who has faced adversity and shown the courage to confront life's realities. He demonstrates enthusiasm and is a strong candidate for the soccer or baseball program.

The Bob Greco '70 Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement, with preference given to a member of St. Jane Frances or Monsignor Slade Parish.

The John and Eileen Grund Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance and will be granted to a student from Baltimore City.

The Grzymiski Family Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement, with preference given to a member of St. Clare Parish or a graduate of St. Clare School.

The Gerard E. and Constance Holthaus Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and a minimum 3.0 grade point average, with preference given to a Baltimore City resident involved in athletics and other co-curricular activities.

The Fr. Dennis Jaworek, OFM Conv. Memorial Scholarship

This award is given to a student based on financial need.

The Robert C. Jirsa Memorial Scholarship

This award is given to a student based on financial need. The student must maintain a 3.0 grade point average and have an exemplary disciplinary record.

The Randy Jones '65 Memorial Scholarship

The award supports Curley's Blackfriars' Theatre program (not an individual student).

The Lyn F. Joven, MD Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement, with preference given to students of Filipino ancestry.

The Margaret and Leo Jubb Scholarship Fund

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a member of the golf program.

The Fr. Julian Memorial Scholarship

This award is given annually to a freshman basketball player to be applied toward sophomore-year tuition. (The corpus of this scholarship is held by Our Lady of the Angels Province, Conventual Franciscan Friars, who determine the size of the award, currently \$1250.)

The Raymond L. Kaczorowski Scholarship

This award is based on financial need.

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance. Preference is given to students with a family member who is active in the Knights of Columbus.

The Saint Maximilian Kolbe Scholarship

This award is given to a student based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement.

The Lijewski Family Scholarship

This award is based on financial aid, with preference given to a member of the Honors Program.

The Lumen Christi Scholarship

This award is based on financial need, with preference given to a young man from St. Elizabeth of Hungary Parish.

The Michael G. Mann Memorial Scholarship

This award is given to a student based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement, with preference given to a student-athlete.

The Edward L. Mason, III Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a graduate of Our Lady of Hope/St. Luke's School.

The Karl L. and Margaret S. Mauck Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement.

The Connor P. McGuinness Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance; satisfactory performance being a "B" in elementary school or a 3.0 GPA in high school. The recipient must be actively involved in the life of the school.

The Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement.

The Mercantile Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement.

The Meyers-Mulheran-Perry Scholarship

The award is based on financial need and intended to provide tuition support to a student from Eastern Baltimore County or City who has the potential to contribute positively to the Archbishop Curley High School community through outstanding academic achievement, participation in athletics, community service, or student organizations. First preference will be given to a young man from the greater Dundalk area.

The Irene and Nicholas Michael Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance.

The Frederick & Edith Muth Scholarship

The award of the Frederick & Edith Muth Memorial Scholarship is based on financial need and high academic achievement.

The John F. J. Myers Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need, with preference given to a young man from the Shrine of the Little Flower Parish. It must be used for tuition only.

The Jean Vecchiarelli Navitskis Memorial Scholarship Fund

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement.

The Nosek Family Scholarship

This award is given to a student based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement, with preference given to a student who has graduated from a Catholic elementary school in the Archdiocese of Baltimore.

The Coach Thomas “Pep” Perrella Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a member of the soccer program.

The Donald W. and Patricia T. Potter Family Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a student active in his Catholic parish.

The Bernie Reif Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a member of the soccer program.

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement, with preference given to a student-athlete.

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a member of the lacrosse program.

The Fr. Tom Walsh, OFM Conv. Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic achievement, with preference given to a member of St. Clement Mary Hofbauer or Annunciation parishes or the son of a Curley alumnus who graduated between 1980 and 2005.

The Weglicki Family Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a student-athlete.

The Scott J. Yeagy Memorial Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a soccer player.

The John F. Zipfel Scholarship

This award is based on financial need and satisfactory academic performance, with preference given to a young man interested in science, particularly natural science, who is a Boy Scout or who has a family member in good standing in the Knights of Columbus. It must be used for tuition only.
